Located on the Mall road of Wah Cantonment, adjacent to the entrance while approaching from Islamabad, a sprawling institute equipped with state of the art teaching/training facilities stands proudly. It is Wah Medical College.

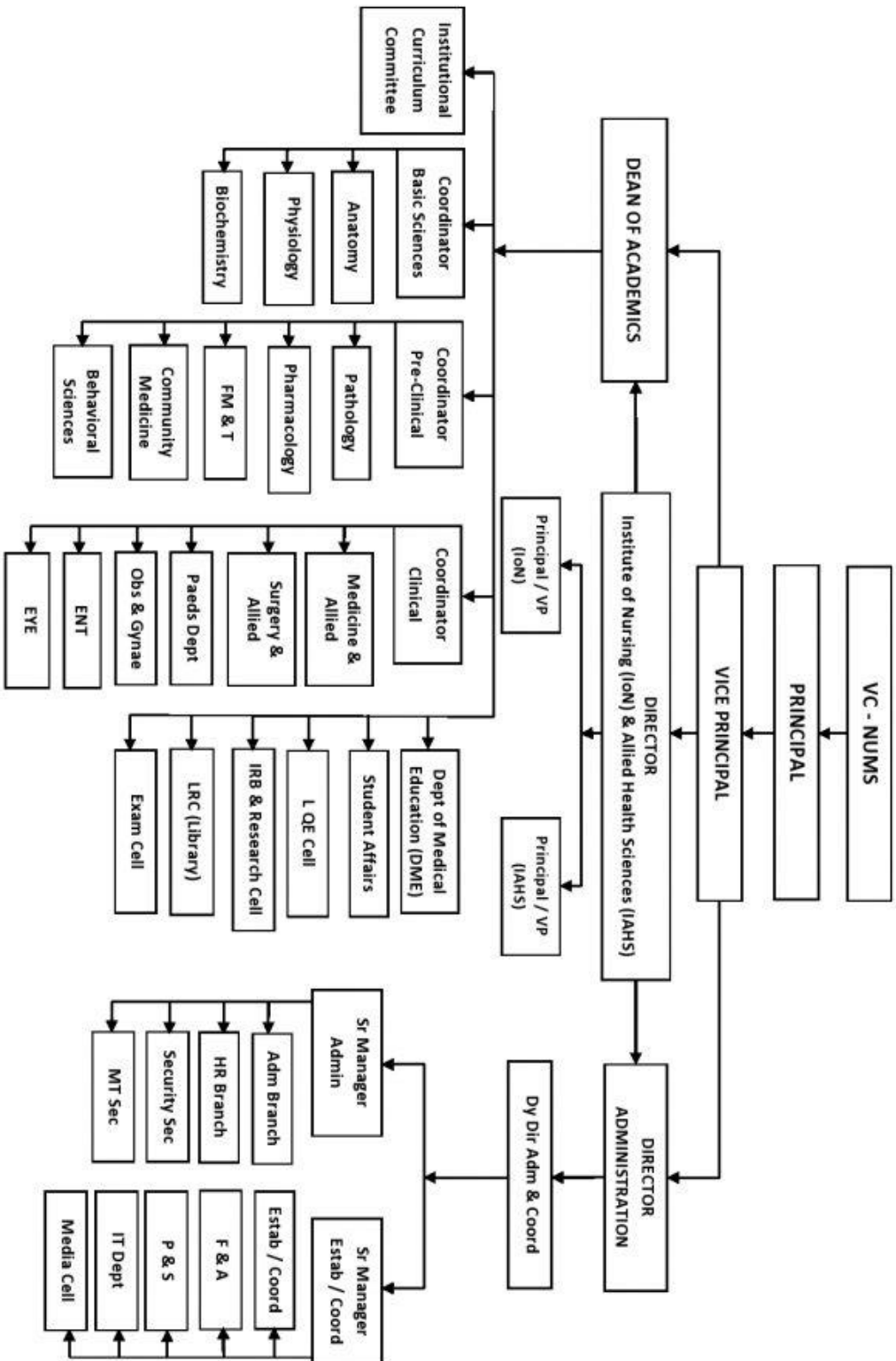
It is part of a composite Medical Education Program, undertaken by the POF (Pakistan Ordnance Factories) Welfare Trust, Wah. POF Hospital is the teaching hospital of WMC. It is a 648 bedded tertiary care hospital recognized by the Pakistan Medical Commission (PMC) and College of Physicians and Surgeons Pakistan (CPSP) for undergraduate as well as postgraduate clinical training. It is also registered with the World Health Organization (WHO), General Medical Council-UK (GMC-UK), Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates-USA (ECFMG-USA) and is included in the list of World Directory of Medical Schools.

In the year 2003 the already existing health care facilities provided an excellent base for setting up a medical college. A strong infrastructure for the college was set up and the first batch of 100 students joined WMC with full confidence and embarked on the academics in January 2004. Since its inception, the College has been approved by the PMC and remained affiliated with the University of Health Sciences (UHS) Lahore which is a public sector University, till 2016. Now the college is affiliated with National University of Medical Sciences (NUMS). Thirteen batches have been graduated so far. In December 2021, WMC achieved a milestone of induction of 150 students in MBBS program.

FACILITIES

To look after the needs of tomorrow, the Project Management Board constructed the college campus on a vast piece of land adjacent to the teaching hospital.



To meet the academic needs of the learners, the college is divided in three divisions.

The Basic Medical Sciences Division comprises of the Departments of Anatomy, Biochemistry and Physiology. All the departments are headed by well learned Professors, respective academic teams and equipped with all the necessary teaching aids.

The Pre-Clinical Medical Sciences Division includes the Departments of Pathology, Community Medicine, Pharmacology and Forensic Medicine. Again, all the departments are headed by highly reputed Professors, host highly learned faculty and state of the art teaching facilities.

The Clinical Division comprises of two subdivisions i.e. Medical division and Surgical Division. The former includes the Departments of General Medicine, Pediatrics Medicine, Emergency Medicine, Dermatology and Psychiatry. These departments are also headed by highly experienced and reputed clinicians. The well versed teams of doctors are engaged in imparting medical training along with the provision of safe health care to the patients. It is strengthened further with the facilities like ICU, CCU, Endoscopy, Dialysis, Nephrology, Plastic Surgery & Burn Centre, Emergency Medicine and Physical Rehabilitation.

The Surgical subdivision comprises of the Departments of General Surgery, Orthopedics, Neurosurgery, Urology, Plastic Surgery, Gynecology & Obstetrics, Anesthesiology, Ophthalmology, Otorhinolaryngology and Radiology headed by eminent clinicians. All the departments comprise of capable doctors and the equipment needed for a tertiary care Health Institution.

PROGRAMS OFFERED

MBBS

The MBBS (Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery) is a highly professional undergraduate degree which primarily focuses on the curriculum and aligned objectives required for the preparation of career as a clinician. It takes five years to graduate with an MBBS degree.

Wah Medical College inception took place in 2003. Wah Medical College was previously inducting 100 students each year since 2003 but now seats have been enhanced to 150 after PMC visit in December 2021. The pioneer batch passed out in 2009 and so far 13 batches have graduated. More than 1000 graduates are serving nationally and internationally and putting their contribution to patient care.



Institute of Nursing

Wah Medical College established its Institute of Nursing in January 2015. The mission of the Institute is to provide state-of-the-art nursing education and training to produce professional nursing graduates who are committed, caring, competent and able to facilitate the individuals, families and communities in meeting their health care needs with advance technology supported with scientific knowledge. Institute of Nursing inducts 35 students each year. The institute is known for having:

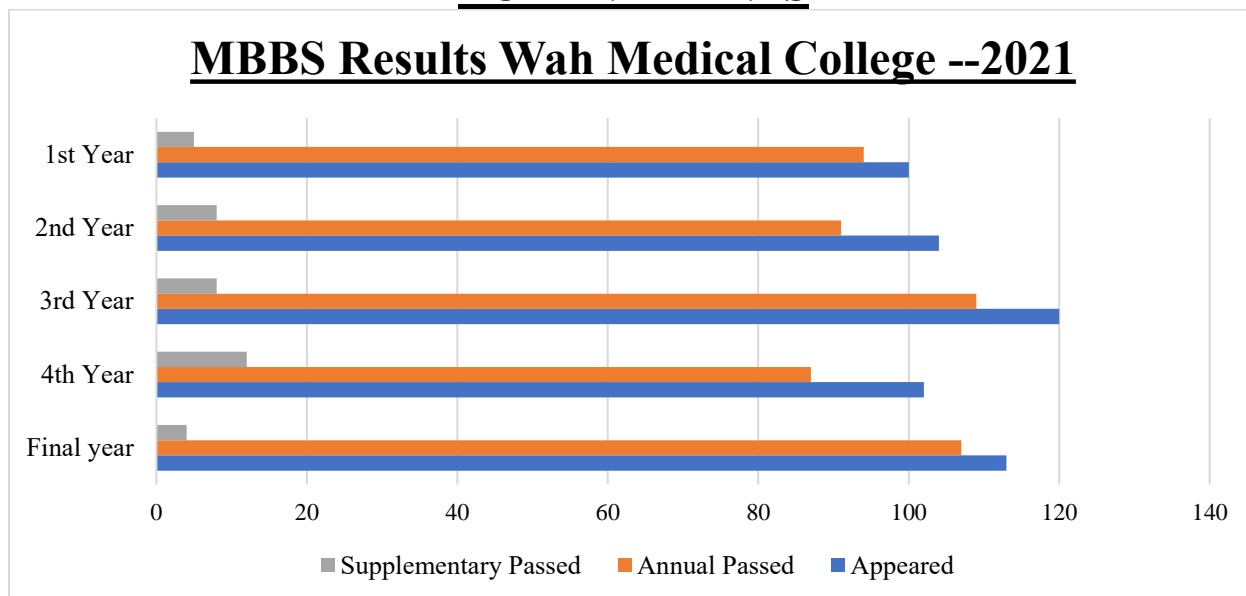

IAHS currently offers 2 years' F.Sc. in Medical Imaging Technology (MIT) , Medical Laboratory Technology (MLT) & Associate Degree in Blood Transfusion Medicine 9AD-BTM).The theory and demonstration classes are held in the institute itself, whereas, the practical training is imparted at fully equipped, 759 bedded, POF hospital which is a tertiary care teaching hospital recognized by Pakistan Medical Commission (PMC) and College of Physicians and Surgeons of Pakistan (CPSP). In addition, the hands on training is also imparted at Izzat Ali Shah Hospital, Wah Cantt. He is also working as a Professor of Medical Oncology at the Donald and Barbara Zucker School of Medicine USA.

He is recognized internationally as a renowned expert and Key Opinion Leader (KOL) in the fields of Gastrointestinal (GI) cancers, Experimental Therapeutics and Pharmacogenetics. Professor Muhammad Wasif Saif has worked as a principal investigator for more than 65 prospective cancer clinical trials. He has published more than 600 peer-reviewed articles about cancer treatment and research, over 90 abstracts, and over 2 dozens of book chapters.

He holds the vision of a strategic leader with knowledge and experience in academic institutions, health centers, and teaching hospitals. He was also selected as the "America's Top Oncologist" as well as the "Leading physician of the World". He talked about the etiology, prevention, treatment of Colon Cancer, and students and faculty attended the session. Session was concluded with vote of thank by the Dean.
