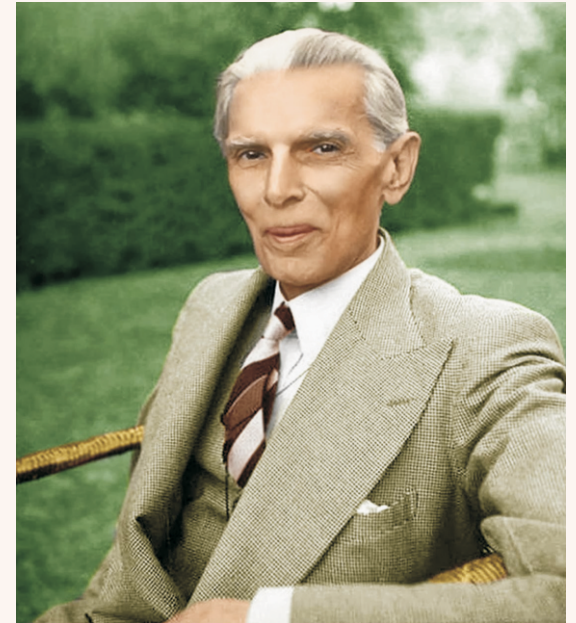

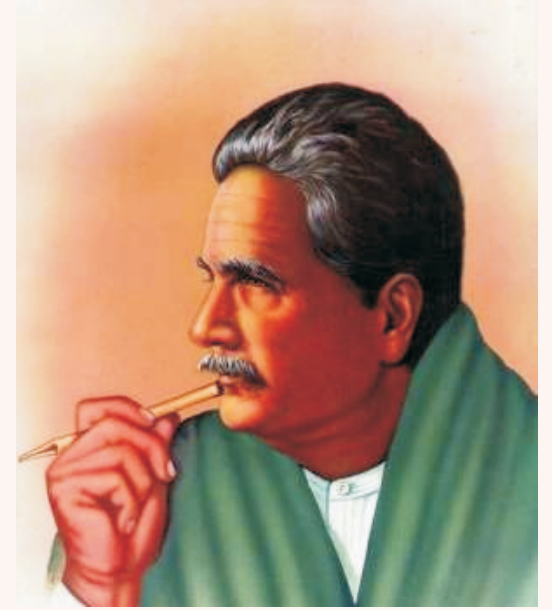

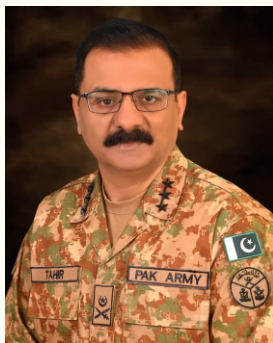

Introduction

Wah Medical College (WMC) is part of a composite Medical Education Programme undertaken by the Pakistan Ordnance Factories (POF). Since the induction of the first batch of students in early 2004, the College has grown and now stands tall among the medical colleges of the region. It is recognized by the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council (PM&DC) and is registered in the World Directory of Medical Schools. WMC was recognized for seat enhancement for up to 150 MBBS students by PM&DC and scored highest in the country (98%) after the PMC inspection. The purpose-built campus has all the facilities, including state-of-the-art library and auditorium. Separate hostels for boys and girls and spacious grounds provide a safe and comfortable environment for academic and extracurricular activities. POF Hospital and Izzat Ali Shah Hospital are the teaching hospitals of WMC. POF Hospital is a 670-bed teaching hospital of the College, which is recognized for house jobs and postgraduate training (FCPS) by PM&DC and CPSP. The College is affiliated with NUMS, a public-sector national medical university.

WMC is easily accessible, on Mall Road in Wah Cantt. The College has very experienced and highly qualified faculty. WMC has made a niche among the country's best medical institutes, and our graduates have excelled in both undergraduate and post-graduate studies. Many students have secured positions in university exams, and scores of our graduates have completed postgraduate qualifications from Pakistan and abroad. LEARNING STRATEGIES

Education is the transformation of a fledgling into a lifelong seeker of knowledge; it is the inculcation of such a love of learning that inspires the seeker to explore new avenues way beyond the ones stipulated by the coaches. Wah Medical College, in the truest of spirits, is dedicated to infusing this love of learning in its students. Our most significant concern is not what we 'teach' but what our student gets to 'learn'. We aim to train proficient doctors with medical knowledge and clinical skills that make them solve clinical community problems appropriately.

The College curriculum is based on the SPICES Model of educational strategies, where we intend to impart medical knowledge through a continuum of approaches: student-centered, problem-based, integrated, community-oriented, evidence based and systematic. Our curriculum has evolved by taking into consideration traditional, experiential, behavioral, and constructivist perspectives of curricula.

The curriculum is organized and integrated along horizontal and vertical dimensions. The content taught is integrated concurrently in themed horizontal organization and vertically across the years of medical education. Generic competencies are being taught as part of the basic sciences curriculum. Our students learn medical knowledge in a holistic, integrated manner, thus allowing them to gain expertise in clinical skills alongside the acquisition of medical knowledge.

Our educational strategy is based upon the curriculum of studies of MBBS, as laid down by the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council and the National University of Medical Sciences, Rawalpindi

Academic lectures, though modified for active learning, are held in the state-of-the-art lecture theaters. theatres spacious and air-conditioned, but they are spacious and air-conditioned and well equipped with the latest audiovisual aids like multimedia, overhead projectors and video presenters. Learning is facilitated by seasoned faculty members who provide the students with a roadmap to knowledge tailored to learning objectives and identify practical relevance and the latest trends in the subject. Students learn through a variety of audiovisual aids and are encouraged to actively participate in reflecting and developing an understanding of the topic through interaction. . To enhance relevance and students' interest, learning strategies such as case-based learning and small group problem-solving sessions are also effectively utilized.



Tutorials / Small Group Sessions

Active student involvement and self-regulation of learning are fundamental to developing lifelong learners. For this purpose, students are provided with a variety of platforms to enhance their learning and consolidate concepts. Student presentations, interactive sessions, and peer discussions are the modalities employed to promote students' contribution to learning and encourage students to interact with and learn from their peers.

Hands-On Training

Inert knowledge that is not utilized or put into practice has no role in the field of medicine. For this reason, practical and hands-on training sessions are incorporated from the very early years to develop relevance and reinforce the concepts developed in teaching sessions. Laboratory work is a critical part of training in Physiology, Biochemistry, Histology, Pharmacology and Pathology. Experiential learning adds to students' interest and leads to greater retention of concepts to be applied in practical life. Dissection Hall in Anatomy is one such avenue that allows the students to learn the gross anatomical structures through direct observation, thus endowing students with a sound basis of knowledge that can be utilized in their surgery practice. The Power Lab in the Physiology department is fulfilling the needs of contemporary medical training.

Knowing is not enough; we must apply!



Clinical Teaching

Theoretical and practical knowledge is supplemented by clinical case presentations and mandatory ward rotations in all disciplines to provide students with clinical exposure in the pre-clinical and clinical classes.

Seminars

Wah Medical College regularly organizes seminars where groups of students present topics of general interest before a larger audience. This widens their scope of learning and promotes their knowledge and communication skills.

Skills Lab

Skills laboratories, or “skills labs”, are specific practical skill training facilities, which are a firmly established part of medical education, offering the possibility of training clinical procedures in a safe and fault-forgiving environment prior to real-life application at the bedside or in the operating room. Skills lab training follows a structured teaching concept, ideally creating an atmosphere that allows the repeated, anxiety and risk-free practice of targeted skills. Wah Medical College provides a fully equipped skills lab that is utilized across all five years for simulated teaching for all students. This also ensures that learners go through a standardized, trainer-led training program that provides the basis for competence-based assessment of student skills.



Community Oriented Learning

A doctor cannot be regarded as a true professional if he is not cognizant of the community's needs and does not contribute to raising the local community's health standard. Within the ambit of Community-Oriented Education Programs, the students and faculty of WMC actively serve the general community, which also develops a sense of community ownership in the students.

Our students are active participants in carrying out community-based research. Moreover, they are encouraged to participate in the preventive and curative care of patients in Primary Health Care settings. The students participate in the Anti-Polio campaign and in the surveillance regarding School Health Service. Every student of 3rd year MBBS conducts a household survey individually. Since its inception, students have been taking part in a vast campaign for community awareness about emerging and prevalent health problems and their control.



Information Technology (IT)

Information technology forms the core of any institution, and Wah Medical College recognizes its importance in the field of education. Currently, two state-of-the-art computer labs facilitate students with internet access and provide up-to-date hardware and software to maximize e-learning. It also includes networked PCs linked to a wide range of software and print services. The IT Section of the institution is providing high-speed Internet facilities over optical fibre via LAN, WAN and Wifi networks to all the departments and computer labs. WMC is also connected to HEC digital library for research and development. WMC is equipped with audio-visual facilities, including overhead/multimedia projectors, software programs, touch screens, etc. These services are provided in lecture halls, tutorial rooms, museums and conference rooms, which play an important role in education.



To enhance IT services and provide high-speed Internet facilities with the least downtime, the IT Section has improved its IT infrastructure and established a Data Center to meet the college's IT demands. Moreover, IP Cameras are installed to monitor the College campus.

Media Cell

A Media Cell has been established to keep the website updated about the various achievements and ongoing events in the college and affiliated hospitals. It also provides photographic coverage of all indoor and outdoor events.

DEPARTMENT OF MEDICAL EDUCATION

The Department of Medical Education (DME) is committed to promote excellence in teaching, implement and monitor curriculum, recognize outstanding teachers, assure quality and accountability by using evidence-based practices. It aims at providing opportunities of professional development for the faculty and alumni of Wah Medical



College.

The Department of Medical Education at WMC was established in April 2008. Dr. Tariq Mahmood Mufti, a Professor of Anesthesiology, was the department's first In-charge/Coordinator.

The DME at WMC works in collaboration and in accordance with the outlines provided by NUMS and the requirements of PM&DC received from time to time. The department is now conducting regular activities and workshops and is involved in various academic aspects of the MBBS program at WMC.



Aims & Objectives:

The Department of Medical Education works with the following objectives:

- Making an impact on healthcare delivery by using best-evidence medical education principles. Working with the Academic Council at WMC to regularly update the curriculum in line with the latest guidelines of the NUMS and the PM&DC.
- Raising the standard of teaching/learning activities through appropriate faculty training from both basic and clinical sciences according to modern principles of medical education.
- Assessing student performance according to national and international standards of achievement.
- Assuring quality and accountability in the delivery of medical education.
- Supervising and conducting the pre-, per and post-hoc evaluation of all examinations conducted across all the subjects.
- Ensuring academic management through the Institutional Curriculum Committee (ICC). The ICC comprises a modular committee that includes basic sciences, pre-clinical, and clinical coordinators, along with heads of relevant departments, to oversee the implementation of all policies pertaining to curriculum, assessments (both summative and formative), and attendance. The ICC also ensures that the information is duly shared with the students on a regular basis

INSTITUTIONAL CURRICULAR COMMITTEE (ICC)

The ICC is a standing committee of the academic council. It is responsible for ensuring curricular development, implementation, and review, followed by the integration of feedback that is consistent with the guidelines provided by the NUMS and the PM&DC. It ensures that the MBBS program is aligned with the mission and vision of the college as required by accreditation standards set forth by the World Federation of Medical Education (WFME). It is responsible for designing, managing, integrating, evaluating, and continually improving the WMC curriculum. The ICC is further divided into three sub-committees:

1. Block committees- Basic sciences
2. Block committees- Pre-clinical sciences
3. Block committees-Clinical sciences

BLOCK COMMITTEES

There will be a block committee for each Block. The Basic, Pre-Clinical, or Clinical coordinators will formulate two or three block committees as per the requirement for each class before the start of each session each year, with the consensus of the concerned HODs.

The Block committee will ensure that the Block structure and implementation are according to the guidelines provided by the NUMS and the PM&DC. The in charge of the block committee will set the final timetables, arrange pre-block meetings during the block meetings and prepare block documents. The medical educationist, being a member of block committees, develops a study guide for every year and ensures feedback from the faculty and the students for quality in medical education.

LOCAL QUALITY ENHANCEMENT CELL

Wah Medical College complies with the policies and guidelines set by NUMS University, HEC, and PMC. The establishment of the Local Quality Enhancement Cell (LQEC) in 2019 is an example of this compliance. The most important function of LQEC is to strengthen internal and external quality assurance, and it functions as part of QEC-NUMS to ensure that high academic standards are maintained in teaching and learning at WMC.

INSTITUTIONAL EXAMINATION CELL

WMC has established an Examination Cell. The Dean of WMC, Professor Musarat Ramzan is the Chief Controller of Examinations, Maj (Retd) Prof Dr Khalida Ajmal, HOD Pharmacology, is the Controller of Examinations, and Dr Ayesha Afzal, Associate Prof. Pharmacology, is the Deputy Controller. Assistant Controller Examinations appointed by NUMS Mr Nouman Bashir regularly monitors the training and assessment carried out at the college. The WMC Examination Cell coordinates with the Examination Cell at the University level and assists in conducting internal and university examinations at WMC. The Examination cell is responsible for the following:

- Printing and photocopying question papers at least 48 hours before the examination assures a high level of secrecy.
- Centralized checking and marking of MCQs by Optical Mark Reader (OMR). The OMR has the built-in ability to assess the different aspects of the MCQs.
- Safe record keeping of the university's professional examination-related material.
- Conduct of end of block and pre annual examination.
- Conduct of all professional examinations in collaboration with NUMS.
- Conduct of Institute of Nursing Exams
- Conduct of Exams of Institute of Allied Health Sciences.

The Institutional Examination Cell of Wah Medical College (WMC) is dedicated to maintaining the highest standards in assessment procedures. With the recent establishment of the NUMS Online Multisystem Exam System (NOMES) at WMC, the efficiency, security, and standardization of our examination processes have been significantly enhanced. This robust system minimizes errors, streamlines the examination process, and ensures a consistent assessment experience for all students. Additionally, an Assistant Controller of Examination has been nominated by NUMS to oversee and support the effective implementation of this system within our institution.

The installation of 165 PCs for NOMES is likely to enhance the testing environment, improve exam management, and facilitate a more efficient examination.

EVALUATION AND EXAMINATIONS

Continuous Assessment

The transformation of an individual into a professional doctor is a gradual, ongoing process. In this regard, students prepare themselves for annual examinations and keep striving for their ultimate goal throughout the year. Regular internal examinations assess the learning. During a block, students are continually assessed formatively. However, the block ends with the summative assessment.

At the end of the year, the University conducts a summative assessment according to the standards laid down by the PM&DC.

ELIGIBILITY FOR A PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATION

A student shall be eligible to appear in a professional examination subject to fulfilling the following conditions, namely:

- a. Registered in NUMS and studied the prescribed courses during the academic year
- b. Attended 75% of the lecturers, demonstrations, tutorials and practical or clinical work, both in-patients and out-patients. For clinical subjects, cumulative attendance of all clinical years shall be considered.
- c. Paid the subscribed examination fee.
- d. Paid all college/institute dues for the current academic year.
- e. Has no major disciplinary case during the current academic year.



HONOURS AND AWARDS

Although currently an affiliate of NUMS, WMC remained affiliated with the UHS, Lahore, in the past. This affiliation provided affiliation to more than thirty-three medical colleges, including eleven well-established public sector medical colleges in Punjab with outstanding repute. The students of WMC, besides displaying distinctively better results in various MBBS Professional Examinations conducted by NUMS, Rawalpindi, secured top positions in the college.

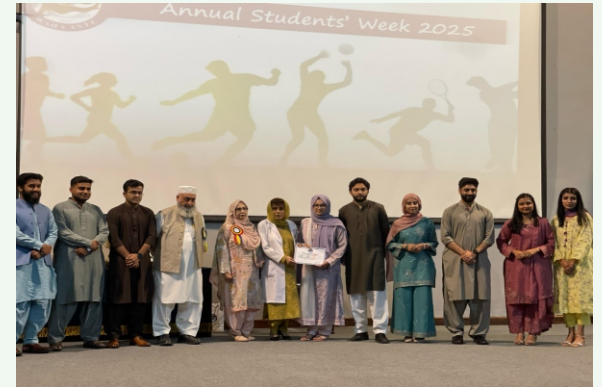
WHITE COAT CEREMONY

College Library

The college library is located in the basement of the academic block. It provides a welcoming, comfortable and favourable environment for learners to achieve their educational goals. All the students, faculty members and staff are entitled to library membership. The library is stocked with more than 9000 books and has a seating capacity for 160 persons at a time. It provides the latest information and research material for both students and faculty. In addition to medical books and journals, it contains multiple books related to Urdu and English literature and Islamic history. An online catalogue provides access to e-journals and e-books to keep readers abreast of recent advances in medical education. It also possesses a well-equipped audio-visual section, a modern computer lab with workstations, a reference section and an electronic catalogue database. In addition, a well-trained and friendly library staff is available to guide the students. In case of need, readers can also access the central library of Wah Cantt and POF hospital library.

In addition to regular college hours, the library also remains open in the evening for specific timings. Users are strictly to observe all rules and regulations at all times. A fine is levied for any infringement of these rules. Students are required to have their own sets of prescribed textbooks. However, books and journals for reference can also be accessed online.



Auditorium

A modern, state-of-the-art, well-furnished auditorium is situated on the college premises. It is centrally air-conditioned, with a seating capacity for 1,000 persons, and is equipped with security cameras, multimedia projectors, and a flawless sound system. It befittingly holds formal events like convocations, seminars, national academic competitions, and conferences.



Solar Park

Reon Energy Solution has launched the first solar power plant for a medical college to initiate an alternate energy resource. It provides a 700 KWA solar supply, making WMC the first medical college to go green.



Book Shop

A bookshop is located on the college campus on the ground floor. Students can purchase textbooks, reference books, journals, logbooks, diaries, calendars, and other stationery items at subsidized rates.



Masjid

A masjid with a capacity of approximately 400 persons was recently commissioned on the college campus for the theological needs of the students, faculty, and staff. The masjid is close to the main college building and boys' hostel.



Cafeteria

There is an independent and spacious cafeteria for the students and college staff in the academic block where delicious food, prepared under hygienic conditions, is available at very reasonable rates. Separate seating arrangements have been provided for girls and boys.

General Hostel Rules

1. Accommodation/room allotment will be purely based on seniority and merit. First-year students' aggregate marks on the admission list will be used to prepare their merits.
 2. Temporary allotments to first-year students will be made on a first-come, first-served basis until the final allotment.
 3. Final allotment will be made once a year on departure of old final year MBBS students. However, temporary allotment may be done if required, till the final allotment
 4. Hostel dues will be deposited in advance on monthly, quarterly and yearly basis. If a student wishes to stay in the hostel for less than 3 months and the request is accepted by the administration as a special case, he/she will have to pay Rs. 1,500/—per day for a tri-seater and actual messing charges.
 5. If a student is removed from the college roll on disciplinary/administrative grounds, no fee, including the hostel dues, will be refunded.
 6. If a non-boarder student has to stay in the hostel for evening classes, ward duties, or maternity rotation, he/she will be charged only the actual food expense for the duration of the stay and no room charges.
 7. Hostels remain closed during vacations, Eid Ul Fitr, and Eid Ul Azha holidays. All students are required to vacate the hostels and deposit the room keys with the hostel administration except those attending official activities, if any, during vacations.
 8. The room status during the year may be upgraded but not downgraded, i.e., shifting from tri-seater to bi-seater or cubical will be allowed on additional payment of the difference in amount, but the reverse will not be allowed.
 9. All final-year students who have stayed for the previous two years will be allotted cubical rooms on normal tri-seater charges in vogue for the current academic year. After the final year, fourth-year students will be allotted cubical facilities based upon availability of rooms and merit (percentage of marks obtained in all professional MBBS Exams) on bi-seater charges.
 10. In case of any dispute, decision of the Principal WMC will be final.
- Dues can be increased annually to offset inflationary effect.

Rules for Fatima Hostel

- No student (except sick students) will be served meal or tea in her room.
- Students are strictly forbidden to take the kitchen / mess crockery to their rooms, it is a punishable offence.
- Ayahs are not bound to work for the private kitchens of the girls.
- Students are strictly forbidden to stay outside the hostel after 9:00 PM. The main gates will be kept locked from 9:00 PM to 7:00 AM. Only the students performing maternity duty will be allowed after 9:00 PM.
- Students are directed to produce written permission letters duly signed by their parents to visit their relatives' houses. Each student should provide a list of the relatives who will visit them in the hostel and vice versa
- The boarders will display their college cards, which will be checked by the security guards when leaving or entering the hostel.

Rules of Jinnah Hostel

- No student (except sick students) will be served a meal or tea in his room.
- Students are strictly forbidden to take kitchen/mess crockery to their rooms; it is a punishable offence.
- Visitors are not allowed in the boys' hostel.
- Hostel students will not leave the hostel without written permission from the warden.
- Students are strictly forbidden to stay outside the hostel after 10 p.m. in Winter and 11 p.m. in Summer.
- Students are directed to produce written permission letters duly signed by their parents to visit their relatives' houses. Each student should provide a list of the relatives who will visit them in the hostel and vice versa.
- All hostellite students are advised to use Electricity, Gas, and Water judiciously. Students will be charged in case of excessive billing.
- The use of electricity heaters and rods is not allowed. If anyone is found, appropriate disciplinary action will be taken as per college rules.
- The parent's written permission to allow their son to keep the vehicle in the college will be deposited with the Students Affairs Department. The concerned student will get written permission from the principal to keep the vehicle in the college premises.
- A photocopy of the registration book will be deposited in the Student Affairs Department.
- In case documents of the vehicle are bogus or of the left or stolen, the student will be responsible, and the college administration will not take any responsibility.
- The college/ Hostel timings will be adhered to, and NO vehicle will be allowed to leave the MT Part of the college premises after 10 p.m. In an emergency, the warden's written permission will be obtained and deposited with the security guard.
- The vehicle will be parked at the college parking lot, and no student is allowed to take it within the vicinity of the hostel.

Note

- No student will be allowed to enter WMC / POF Hospital without a college ID card, and ensure to keep it displayed while on campus.
- All footwear will be closed-toe and closed-heel, clean and in good condition.
- All boys will have trimmed haircuts, and their beards and moustaches will be cleaned, trimmed, and groomed.
- Girls' hair will be pinned and tied back in laboratories and patient care areas.
- Students will wear knee-length white coats (overalls) during college/hospital duty hours. Violating the dress code is strictly prohibited and entails disciplinary action.
- Roll numbers of the students violating the uniform code will be duly noted and passed on to the Student Affairs Department weekly to impose a fine.

RAGGING

- Ragging in any form will be strictly prohibited in the hostel/college premises, resulting in grave consequences.

Wah Cantonment is situated 40 Km North West of Islamabad on the main highway to Peshawar. Taxila, a centre of Gandhara civilization and a tourist attraction, surrounds this town in the East. Educational Facilities

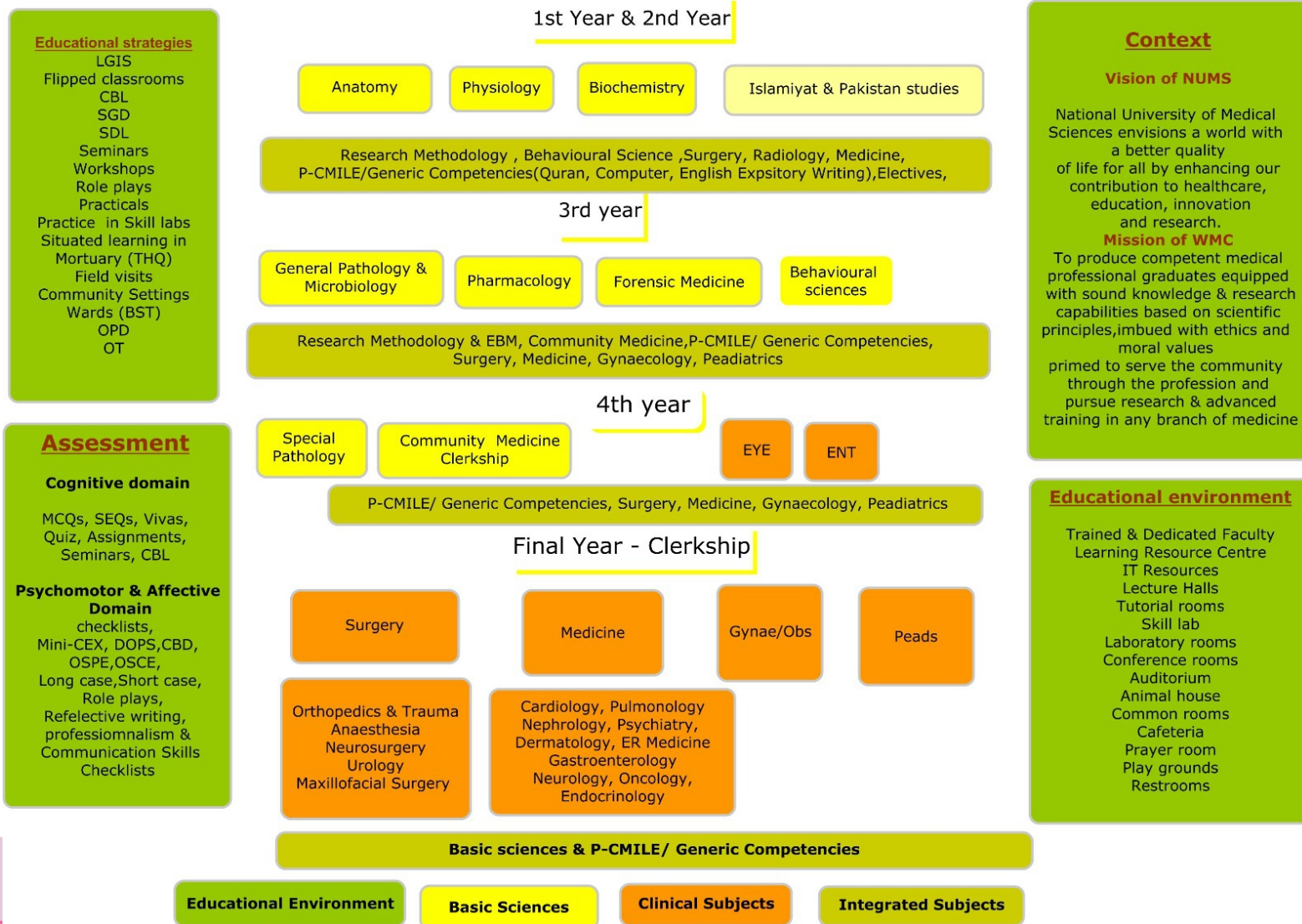

Curriculum Map of Wah Medical College 2025



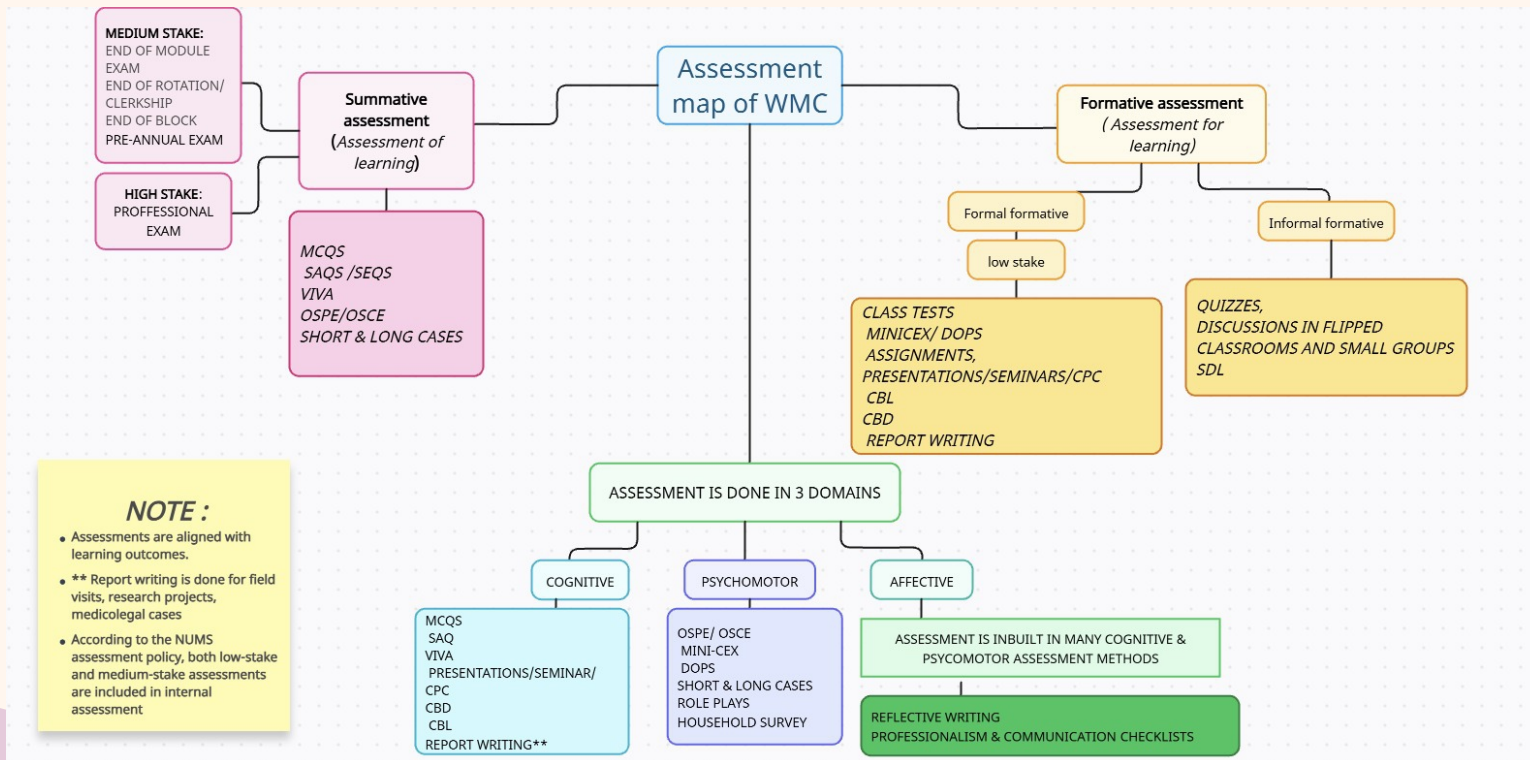

Assessment Strategies

During the block, the students shall be continually formatively assessed.

- According to NUMS policy, the weightage of internal assessment shall be 20% in all five professional MBBS Examinations
- There shall be three end-of-block exams and one pre-annual examination.
- The scores of tests at the end of each block assessment and pre-annual examination shall be used to calculate the internal assessment, which will be submitted to the NUMS examination branch at least two weeks before the annual exam.
- The structure of the papers for all the block and pre-annual examinations will be the same as that for the annual examination, but the syllabus will be different.
- The department will announce the block examination syllabus at least 02 weeks before the examination.

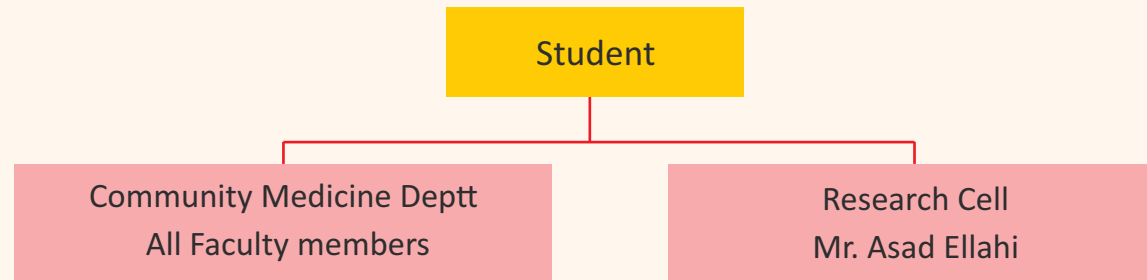

Students interested in conducting research may take guidance from the Research Cell or the Community Medicine department.



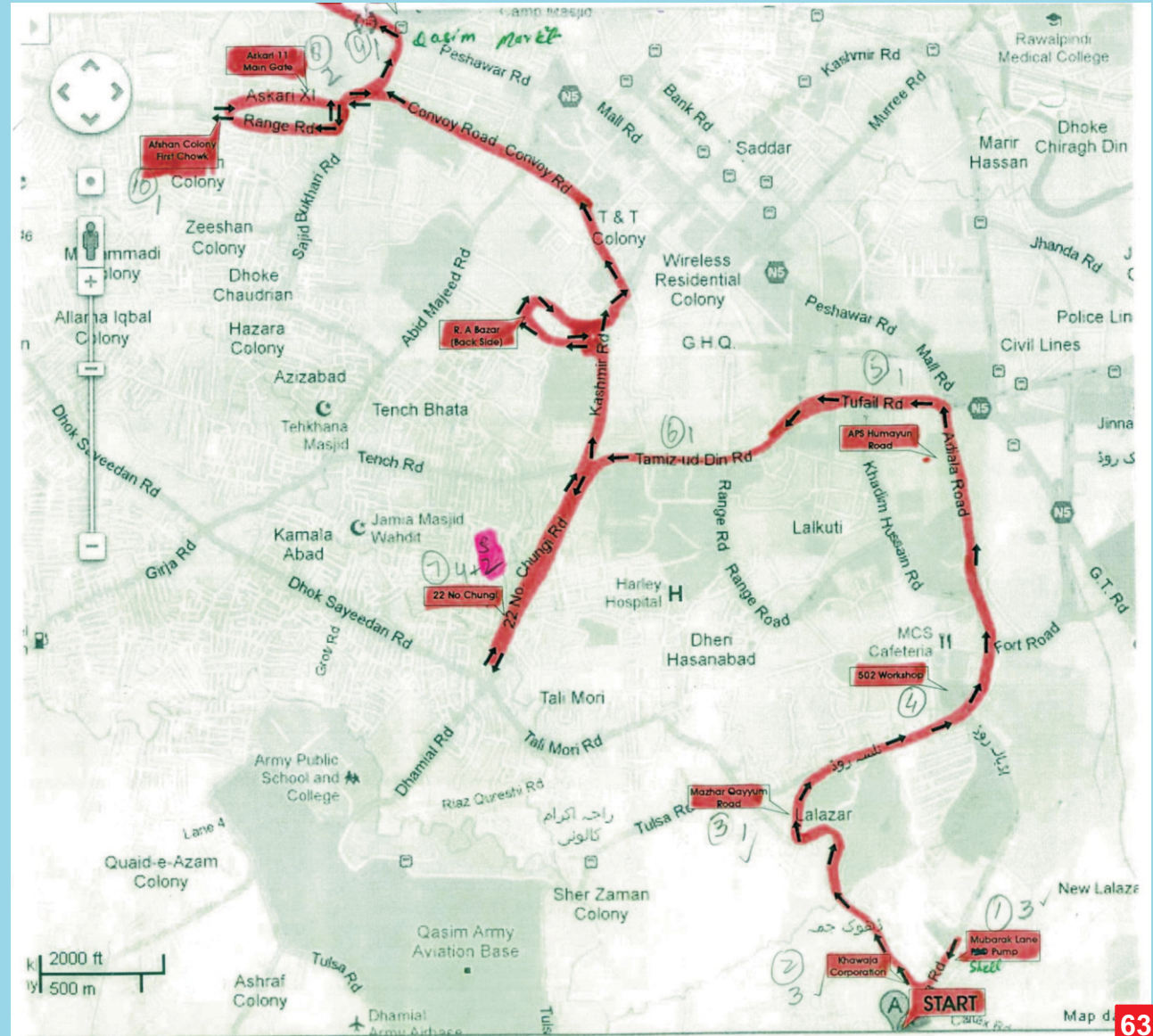
METHOD TO APPROACH COLLEGE AUTHORITY
